We plan to collect the cards and put them into a photo album with some photos we have of Skylar and Coby-Jay to give to their mum, Emma, when a little time has passed. We hope that, in time, this may help her find a little solace during the difficult weeks and months ahead. Our thoughts and prayers are with Emma at this time, and with their family and friends. We ask you to join us in a 2 minute silence to remember the family this Sunday at 11am.

We have spent a lot of time outdoors this week as the weather has been so lovely. There has been lots of hide and seek, scavenger hunts, poetry writing, water balloon fights and some splashing in water to try to keep ourselves cool. The children are happy to be in school and parents are reporting that they are all glad of a little routine and normality.

Again, priority will be given to pupils on the special needs register or pupils who are struggling to keep up with work at home while children are being taught again in school.
