Dear Parents, Carers and Children

Once again we have had a lovely week. The children are now getting used to where they can go at lunchtimes, and lessons are looking more like they used to. We have tried to make the most of the lovely weather; getting outside whenever we can. Since we came back staff have been getting to grips with exactly where children are in their learning so that we can plan for any gaps that may have appeared since lockdown. Please continue to use our online resources at home—TTRockStars and Spelling Shed—to support learning in school.

As part of the guidance for all schools, we have been asked to develop plans to continue highquality teaching and learning in the event of a closure of a bubble, local or national lockdown. Today we sent out a survey via text to find out about families' access to devices and Wi-Fi. It is **vital that all families complete the survey** in order for us to establish secure plans and to identify where and what support will be needed to ensure all children are able to access learning remotely should bubbles, or school, be closed.

I am becoming increasingly concerned about cars on Cambridge Street at drop-off and pick up time. As a dead end, there have always been issues but the problems are being made worse by the current situation. Cars have always had to U-turn to make their way out but this is becoming more dangerous as pupils and parents group around their allocated gates. Families blocking the pavements means that children are often forced to walk on the road. In addition, many parents making their way up or down Cambridge Street prefer to walk in the road in order to socially distance themselves from others. I have asked Barrow Borough Council to look into whether we can close Cambridge Street from Bolton Street up at selected times to make it safer for everyone in our school community. I hope that, although inconvenient, you appreciate my considerable concerns. I will keep you updated of the progress we make.

Yesterday, I was sent further information informing me that there is an increase in Covid 19 in Barrow which has lead Public Health Cumbria to issue new advice. People are now being strongly advised that **groups of 6 should be limited to people from no more than 2 households** at any one time.
